

**Proposed Changes  
Necessary in the *Minutes*  
to Reflect the Restructure  
Proposals**





**Explanatory Note:** In January 2010 the International Executive Committee presented an extensive report to the International Executive Council detailing specific actions that needed to be taken in restructuring the International Offices to accommodate the reallocation of resources mandated by the General Assembly.

This report is titled **Report of the International Executive Committee Adopted by the International Council**. A copy has been sent to all ordained bishops and to pre-registered delegates as part of the agenda packet.

These proposed changes could be affected by taking each item to be changed as an individual motion and providing the opportunity for discussion with amendments and a vote. However, because of the expansiveness of the changes, dealing with these items seriatim could easily consume all of the business time allotted for the General Council. Therefore, the Executive Council is seeking the approval of the General Council and the General Assembly to make the editorial changes as noted in this document. (*See Item 7 on the General Council Agenda.*)

Please note that **substitutions** are marked in **red** and underlined and **deletions** are marked in **red** and have a line drawn through them. **Additions** are noted in **blue**.

**I. ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions Board**

**A. Selection**

The ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions Board shall consist of not less than five men who shall be appointed biennially by the International Executive Committee.

**B. Duties and Authorities**

The ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions Board shall

1. Serve the needs of the church as they relate to all phases of  
Evangelism and USA missions.

2. Formulate plans and recommendations related to evangelism  
and ~~home missions work~~church planting. Provide new and practical helps for a vigorous pursuit of a Biblical and balanced evangelistic emphasis.

3. Develop ~~[evangelism] materials~~resources suitable for special fields  
~~[of ministry] such as [to the] blind, deaf, prisons, and such like~~. Offer encouragement for work among all racial and social communities of the nation.

~~4. Prepare plans for the promotion of Evangelism and Home  
Missions Week.~~

~~5. Work to enhance the status of the evangelists in the church,  
and assist them in problems that are peculiar to their ministries on a  
general basis.~~

~~6. Develop and make extensive distribution of literature pertaining  
to evangelism~~ (50th A., 1964, p. 53).

## **II. Director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions**

### **A. Selection, Tenure, and Salary**

The office of the ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions director shall be filled by one who should devote his full time to the promotion of evangelism and ~~home~~USA missions. He shall be nominated by the International General Council and elected by the International General Assembly biennially. He shall be eligible to serve no more than four consecutive years. His salary shall be set by the International Executive Council.

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

The ~~general~~ director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions shall

1. Promote evangelism in all phases throughout the church.
2. Work with the International Executive Committee and respective state overseers in the promotion of new works and in missions states.
3. With the consent of the ~~chairman~~divisional director, have authority to call the ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions Board into session, when it is deemed necessary.
4. Work with the International Executive Committee and respective state overseers in arranging for and the promotion of any regional conferences that may be decided upon.
5. Work with the state overseers in the interest of evangelism and home missions.
6. Direct the Pioneers for Christ program (50th A., 1964, pp. 53, 54).

## **III. Assistant Director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions**

(58th A., 1980, pp. 31, 32)

### **A. Selection, Tenure, and Salary**

The assistant director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions shall be nominated by the International General Council and elected biennially by the International General Assembly. He shall be eligible to succeed himself for one term. His salary shall be set by the International Executive Council.

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

The assistant director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions shall assist the director of ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions.

## **IV. Resolution on ~~Home~~USA Missions** (70th A., 2004, p. 55)

WHEREAS most statistical surveys list the U.S.A. as having the third largest pre-Christian population in the world; and,

WHEREAS we need to develop and implement strategies that view the U.S.A. as a mission field; and,

WHEREAS the World Missions Department has been incredibly successful in its mission efforts and offers multiple methods by which the U.S.A. can be reached for Christ;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That we recognize the U.S.A. as a mission field; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions ~~Department~~ ministry develop and deploy home missionaries and request missionaries from other ethnic and language groups from the international body who make up the Church of God; and,  
BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED That we continue to develop means by which the ~~departments~~ ministries of World Missions and ~~Evangelism and Home~~USA Missions work together in developing strategies and training workers for the world harvest.

**Note: In lieu of having a National Laymen's Board, the members of the International Executive Committee are committed to appointing laypersons to serve on numerous boards, thereby expanding the influence and input of laypersons to general church ministries.**

## **V. National Laymen's Board**

### **A. Selection**

~~The National Laymen's Board shall consist of not less than five laymen, who shall be appointed biennially by the International Executive Committee, with a member of the International Executive Committee and the director of Evangelism and Home Missions as *ex officio* members.~~

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

~~The National Laymen's Board shall~~

- ~~1. Serve as an adjunct to the Evangelism and Home Missions Department.~~
- ~~2. Serve as a liaison between the laymen and the ministers of the church.~~
- ~~3. Emphasize and promote lay participation in evangelism.~~
- ~~4. Promote and formulate plans for laymen's fellowship on the local, state, and national levels.~~
- ~~5. Promote Christian stewardship and publicize the benefits and blessings of both material and spiritual commitment to the cause of Christ.~~
- ~~6. Publicize opportunities and benefits of pedagogy, and formulate plans to encourage lay involvement in the various areas of Biblical and secular teachings.~~
- ~~7. Present reports and recommendations to the International Executive Committee and/or International Executive Council (51st A., 1966, p. 61).~~

## **S12. MINISTRY OF WORLD MISSIONS DEPARTMENT**

(58th A., 1980, pp. 29-31; 68th A., 2000, pp. 78-80)

### **I. World Missions Board**

#### **A. Selection**

The World Missions Board shall consist of not less than seven members who shall be appointed biennially by the International

Executive Committee.

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

This board shall concern itself with the worldwide ministries of the Church of God. Their duties and authorities shall be

1. To develop and set forth the policy of the ministry of World Missions ~~Department~~ and its operation.
2. To consider and approve the annual budget of the ministry of World Missions ~~Department~~ for presentation to the International Executive Council.

### **VI. Unreached People Groups** (70th A., 2004, p. 54)

That our local churches be encouraged to adopt and intercede for an unreached people group. Resource materials will be provided by the ministry of World Missions ~~Department~~.

Further, that all national churches of the Church of God international adopt and implement measurable steps to evangelize and disciple unreached people groups inside and outside of their own regions. (Matthew 28:18-20; Romans 15:19-24; Revelation 5:9.)

### **S13. PROCEDURE FOR FILLING VACANCY**

#### **OF AN ELECTED ~~DEPARTMENT~~ MINISTRY HEAD LEADER** (67th A., 1998, p. 52)

##### **A. Filling Vacancy of ~~Department~~ Ministry HeadLeader**

In the event the office of an elected ~~department~~ ministry head becomes vacant because of death, disability, or the incumbent in any wise being disqualified, the assistant director of said ~~department~~ ministry shall be elevated to the office of director.

##### **B. Filling Vacancy of Assistant ~~Department~~ Ministry HeadLeader**

In the event the office of an elected assistant ~~department~~ Ministry head be vacated because of death, disability, advancement, or the incumbent in any wise being disqualified, the general overseer will submit by mail the names of the next two persons receiving the highest vote for that position, who were not elected to any general office, to the ordained bishops, to select the one who shall fill the vacancy in the ~~department~~ ministry.

Ballots must be returned to the general overseer within 45 days to be valid votes. The one receiving the majority vote shall be declared to fill the unexpired term of the assistant to the ~~department~~ ministry in question.

### **S14. ~~BENEVOLENCE DEPARTMENT~~ MINISTRY OF CARE**

#### **I. Board of Directors**

##### **A. Selection**

Members of the Board of Directors of the Church of God ~~Department~~ of Benevolence Ministry of Care shall be appointed biennially by the International

Executive Committee.

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

The ~~Department of Benevolence~~ Ministry of Care Board of Directors shall

1. Be responsible for all general institutions of benevolence, such as Home for Children, Home for the Aged, Home for Widows, and Home for Ministers.

2. Be responsible for all the disbursements of the ~~Department of Benevolence~~ Ministry of Care funds.

3. Adopt rules and regulations governing the admissions, the operation of the Homes, and to safeguard the interest of all persons who are admitted.

4. Approve all applicants recommended by the ~~director of Benevolence?~~ ? for admissions to the Homes.

## **~~II. Director of Benevolence~~**

### **~~A. Selection and Salary~~**

~~The International General Assembly has created the office of director of Benevolence and the International Executive Committee is authorized to employ and set the salary of the director of Benevolence.~~

### **~~B. Duties and Authorities~~**

~~1. His duties and responsibilities shall be determined by the board of directors as stipulated in the Minutes of the International General Assembly.~~

~~2. He shall recommend applicants for admission to the Homes for approval by the board of directors.~~

~~3. He shall execute the rules established by the Department of Benevolence Board of Directors.~~

~~4. He shall have supervision over the employees.~~

~~5. He shall further be authorized to employ or discharge all employees of the Homes, except the heads of departments, who shall be employed or discharged by the action of the board of directors.~~

~~6. The director, with the cooperation of the board of directors, shall have authority to purchase all supplies for the maintenance of the Homes.~~

## **~~III. Social Services Director~~**

### **~~A. Selection and Salary~~**

~~A person (graduated from an accredited school of social work) shall be selected by the board of directors and approved by the International Executive Committee. His salary shall be set by the board of directors and approved by the International Executive Committee.~~

### **~~B. Duties and Authorities~~**

~~The director and board of directors shall determine the duties of~~

~~the social services director (49th A., 1962, p. 36).~~

## **S15. BOARDS AND COMMITTEES, GENERAL**

### **I. Standing Boards and Committees**

~~5. The department heads, such as director of Publications, Lee University president, director of World Missions, and director of Benevolence, have the right to ask for a meeting of respective boards (40th A., 1945, p. 31; 50th A., 1964, p. 56; 52nd A., 1968, p. 34; [1980]).~~

**Note: The National Pastors Advisory Council recommended the deletion of this council, because it was felt that it has served its purpose and is no longer necessary. Pastors are appointed to numerous boards and serve on the Executive Council, thus giving pastors opportunities to provide input into the operations of the general church and to interact with general leadership.**

~~**V. National Pastors Advisory Council** (65th A., 1994, Item 17; p. 92)~~

~~The National Pastors Advisory Council shall be a standing board consisting of five members, all of whom are gifted and currently active in the pastoral ministry. Said board shall meet at least two times a year with the following portfolio:~~

- ~~1. The facilitation and enhancement of all phases of pastoral ministry.~~
- ~~2. The motivation of dialogue between pastors and general leadership.~~
- ~~3. The development and maintenance of a delivery system for communicating ministry concepts.~~
- ~~4. The procurement and presentation of resource materials for pastoral education.~~
- ~~5. The planning and implementation of the annual National Pastors Advisory Council meeting in conjunction with general leadership.~~
- ~~6. The organization and coordination of the pastors conference at the International General Assembly in conjunction with the general leadership.~~

~~The board shall be under the oversight of the International Executive Committee.~~

**Note: The Chaplain's Commission will continue to function under the Division of Care. This is not deleting the ministry.**

- ~~1. Be responsible for the day-to-day operation of the commission.~~
  - ~~2. Maintain a direct, functional, pastoral, and supervisory relationship with all endorsed personnel.~~
  - ~~3. Screen and approve or disapprove all applications for volunteer and all part-time chaplaincy and specialized ministry personnel.~~
  - ~~4. Submit an annual report to the International Executive Council of all commission activities.~~
  - ~~5. Be the voting representative of the Church of God to national agencies and associations which foster understanding and promotion of chaplaincy and specialized ministry activities.~~
  - ~~6. Be the Church of God liaison to all institutions allocating chaplaincy and specialized ministry positions.~~
  - ~~7. Periodically visit all endorsed personnel as an expression of the church's support for these ministries.~~
- ~~Initially investigate and evaluate all questions or charges with regard to endorsed personnel's indiscretion and/or violation of church teachings, doctrines, or practical commitments and, if necessary, to submit written recommendations for further investigation and/or discipline to the designated state or territorial overseer.~~

### **I. Selection**

The General Board of Education shall consist of not less than five members (at least one of whom shall be from outside the United States), ~~qualified and educationally oriented~~, who shall be appointed biennially by the International Executive Committee. ~~The director of the Office of Ministerial Development and the coordinator of education for Missions shall serve as *ex officio* members by virtue of their positions.~~

## **S19. MEDIA MINISTRIES DEPARTMENT**

~~1. Set the salary of the editor in chief, to be approved by the International Executive Council~~ (45th A., 1954, pp. 30, 31; 57th A., 1978, p. 35).

### **II. General Director of the Ministry of Publications**

#### **A. Selection and Salary**

1. The general director of the Ministry of Publications shall be appointed by the International Executive Committee. He shall be executive head of the

~~Editorial and Publications Department Ministry of Publications~~ and shall be responsible for the total operations of the Publishing House.

2. The International Executive Council shall set his salary.

### **B. Duties and Authorities**

1. The International Executive Council shall outline the areas of job responsibility of the general director of Publications.

2. He shall execute policies as set forth by the Ministry of Editorial and Publications Board. He shall sign a contract that he will not teach, publish, or allow to be taught or published, anything contrary to the Church of God Declaration of Faith, or any other established doctrine of the church. A copy of the Declaration of Faith shall be posted in the office of the general director of the Ministry of Publications.

### **III. Editor in Chief**

#### **A. Selection and Salary**

~~The International Executive Committee shall appoint the editor in chief as a department ministry associate who shall be responsible for all editorial areas. His salary shall be set by the Editorial and Publications Board and approved by the International Executive Council.~~

#### **B. Duties and Authorities**

~~His job description shall be defined by the Editorial and Publications Board. He shall sign a contract that he will not teach, publish, or allow to be taught or published, anything contrary to the Church of God Declaration of Faith, or any other established doctrine of the church. A copy of the Declaration of Faith shall be posted in his office.~~

### **IV. Director of Marketing**

~~The director of marketing shall be nominated by the general director of Publications and approved by the Editorial and Publications Board, who shall set his salary and define his job description. He shall be directly responsible to the general director of Publications (57th A., 1978, pp. 35, 36).~~

### **V. Director of Printing**

~~The director of printing shall be nominated by the general director of Publications and approved by the Editorial and Publications Board, who shall set his salary and define his job description. He shall be directly responsible to the general director of Publications (57th A., 1978, pp. 35, 36).~~

### **VI. Director of Finance and Accounting**

~~The director of finance and accounting shall be nominated by the general director of Publications and approved by the Editorial and Publications Board, who shall set his salary and define his job description. He shall be directly responsible to the general director of publications (57th A., 1978, pp. 35, 36).~~

**VIII. Church of God Evangel** (6th A., 1911, p. 10; 31st A., 1936, p. 35; [1972]; 55th A., 1974, pp. 54, 55)

1. The *Church of God Evangel* is the official journal of the Church of God.

2. Since it is an effective means of acquainting our local congregations

and ministers with the doctrine, polity, and various ministries of the Church of God, and is considered an official voice for Pentecost in the world today,

~~3. All churches shall be encouraged to order at least one roll of *Evangels* and each minister shall be encouraged to be a personal subscriber.~~

~~4. All state overseers, provincial overseers, district overseers, pastors, and evangelists shall put forth special effort to increase circulation of the *Evangel*, and each pastor shall appoint a publications committee from his local church for the purpose of promoting all Church of God publications.~~

~~Each individual receiving his first Church of God ministerial credentials shall be given a complimentary subscription to the *Evangel* by the Church of God Publishing House and shall be encouraged to renew the subscription annually.~~

**Note: The motion to delete the following section will not discontinue Women's Ministries. Women's Ministries will continue under the heading Adult Discipleship in the Division of Discipleship.**

- ~~5. Maintain contact with state Women's Ministries presidents and local Women's Ministries.~~
- ~~6. Gather and disseminate appropriate information in keeping with the declared objectives of the board of directors.~~

#### **C. Authorities**

- ~~1. At such time as the executive director deems advisable, she shall, in consultation with the wife of the general overseer (chairwoman of the advisory council), call a meeting of the board of directors.~~
- ~~2. She shall, on authority of the board, attend appropriate meetings on behalf of the Church of God Department of Women's Ministries.~~
- ~~3. She shall be the agent of the board concerning purchases, contracts, and other business matters.~~
